

## PE and Sport Premium Report for 2017/2018

Amount of premium received: £16,930

Impact:

- Every year six child was able to swim a minimum of 50 meters using a range of strokes effectively.
- Children from reception to year six display gymnastic competence relative to their age.
- The school achieved the Gold School Games Mark award for their commitment, engagement and delivery of competitive school sport in 2017/18.
- All children attend sporting events alongside other local schools. They compete at a range of events and access a range of competitive opportunities which develops resilience and sportsmanship.
- Year five pupils are trained as sports leaders and are able to support playground games which develops their leadership skills.

Sustainability:

- School staff gain valuable CPD when working alongside specialists which has a positive impact on their practice.
- Staff access a wide range of training provided by the Primary School Sports Officer which supports the provision of a varied and exciting PE curriculum for all children.
